To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Director's report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

#### 2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2024."

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

#### 3. RESOLUTION 2 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – ROBERT LEES

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 15.4 of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Mr Robert Lees, a Director who was appointed casually on 16 September 2024, retires, and being eligible, is elected as a Director."

#### 4. RESOLUTION 3 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – STUART MIDDLETON

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of clause 15.2 of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Stuart Middleton, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director."

#### 5. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as a special resolution:

#### **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT**

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

#### 1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at <a href="https://www.fremontpetroleum.com">www.fremontpetroleum.com</a>.

#### 2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

#### 2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report to be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

#### 2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

#### 2.3 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this Meeting.

#### 3. RESOLUTION 2 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – ROBERT LEES

#### 3.1 General

The Constitution allows the Directors to appoint at any time a person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Directors, but only where the total number of Directors does not at any time exceed the maximum number specified by the Constitution.

Pursuant to the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4, any Director so appointed holds office only until the next annual general meeting and is then eligible for election by Shareholders but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors who are to retire by rotation (if any) at that meeting.

Mr Robert Lees, having been appointed by other Directors on 16 September 2024 in accordance with the Constitution, will retire in accordance with the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 and being eligible, seeks election from Shareholders.

Further information in relation to Mr Lees is set out below.

Qualifications, experience and other material directorships	Mr Lees is the founder and executive director of CoySec Services, a firm that provides Company Secretarial and CFO services to ASX listed companies.  Mr Lees has over 30 years of experience in financial markets and has advised and listed a number of mineral exploration companies. From August 2015 to August 2016, he was a non-executive Director of Esperance Minerals, an Australian listed minerals explorer. He has acted as company secretary of a number of ASX listed companies and is currently Company Secretary of 3 ASX companies and 1 NSX company.			
Term of office	Mr Lees has served as a Director since 16 September 2024.			
Independence	If re-elected, the Board considers that Mr Lees will be an independent Director.			
Other material information	The Company conducts appropriate checks on the background and experience of candidates before their appointment to the Board. These include checks as to a person's experience, educational qualifications, character, criminal record and bankruptcy history. The Company undertook such checks prior to the appointment of Mr Lees.			
Board recommendation	Having received an acknowledgement from Mr Lees that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director and having reviewed the performance of Mr Lees since his appointment to the Board and the skills, knowledge, experience and capabilites required by the Board, the Directors (other than Mr Lees) recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution.			

#### 3.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If this Resolution is passed, Mr Lees will be elected to the Board as an independent Director.

If this Resolution is not passed, Mr Lees will not continue in his role as an independent Director. The Company may seek nominations or otherwise identify suitably qualified candidates to join the Company. As an additional consequence, this may detract from the Board and Company's ability to execute on its strategic vision.

#### 4. RESOLUTION 3 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – STUART MIDDLETON

#### 4.1 General

The Constitution sets out the requirements for determining which Directors are to retire by rotation at an annual general meeting.

Mr Stuart Middleton, who has held office without re-election since 30 November 2022 and being eligible retires by rotation and seeks re-election.

Further information in relation to Mr Middleton is set out below.

Qualifications. Mr Middleton, at the time of his appointment, had recently experience and returned to Australia from a 10-year assignment in China as the other material Group Executive for TDS, Banpu Plc, Asian Energy Company with directorships assignments in China, Mongolia, Indonesia, Australia and Thailand. Mr Middleton has also worked in the USA, Indonesia and Columbia. During his time in China he was highly involved with energy, oil and gas, in both conventional and unconventional drilling for CBM and coal mining; he advised both government and a major Asian Energy group relating to Asian American Gas Company, extensive JV vertical and multi-lateral directional wells as well as technology transfer from oil/gas to underground degas directional drilling and degas to mitigate dangerous outburst challenges and the recovery of the gas to reduce the outburt / high gas conditions. Australian by background, Mr Middleton has a Bachelors Degree in Mining Engineering and a Master's Commerce degree with double majors in Finance and Management of Technology (MoT) from The University of Sydney. He has held chartered professional engineering and Certified Mine Manager accreditations. Mr Middleton was the CEO/general manager of the Baal Bone operation in Lithgow, Australia and served on the Oakbridge board in Sydney and numerous other subsidiary boards. Mr Middleton also has a strong background in strategic planning and financial strategy. In addition, he has been engaged as a "Specialist Expert" for major companies and mining houses and has prepared, or had input into, many Due Diligence and Valuation reports. A particular strength being acutely tuned to operations, technical and developing the underlyina fundamental value of resources with over 40 years experience spanning hands-on planning, operating/improvement and management roles. Other current or former listed directorships in the last 3 years: Nil. Term of office Mr Middleton has served as a Director since 19 March 2015and was last re-elected on 30 November 2022. Independence If re-elected, the Board considers that MrMiddleton will be an independent Director. Board Having received an acknowledgement from Mr Middleton that recommen<u>dation</u> he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director and having reviewed the performance of Mr Middleton since his appointment to the Board and the skills, knowledge, experience and capabilites required by the Board, the Directors (other than Mr Middleton) recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution.

#### 4.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If this Resolution is passed, Mr Middleton will be re-elected to the Board as an independent Director.

If this Resolution is not passed, Mr Middleton will not continue in his role as an independent Director. The Company may seek nominations or otherwise identify suitably qualified candidates to join the Company. As an additional consequence, this may detract from the Board and Company's ability to execute on its strategic vision.

#### 5. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

#### 5.1 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% placement capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, an Eligible Entity may seek shareholder approval by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25% (**7.1A Mandate**). The Company is an Eligible Entity.

#### 5.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

For this Resolution to be passed, at least 75% of votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote at the Meeting must be cast in favour of the Resolution.

If this Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If this Resolution is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

#### 6. RESOLUTION 5 – APPROVAL OF EMPLOYEE INCENTIVE SECURITIES PLAN

#### 6.1 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder approval for purposes of Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b)) for the issue of a maximum of 291,234,033 Securities under the employee incentive scheme titled "Employee Incentive Securities Plan" (**Plan**).

The objective of the Plan is to attract, motivate and retain key employees, contractors and other persons who provide services to the Company, and the Company considers that the

adoption of the Plan and the future issue of Securities under the Plan will provide these parties with the opportunity to participate in the future growth of the Company.

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 5.1 above.

Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b)) provides that Listing Rule 7.1 does not apply to an issue of securities under an employee incentive scheme if, within three years before the date of issue of the securities, the holders of the entity's ordinary securities have approved the issue of equity securities under the scheme as exception to Listing Rule 7.1.

Exception 13(b) is only available if and to the extent that the number of equity securities issued under the scheme does not exceed the maximum number set out in the entity's notice of meeting dispatched to shareholders in respect of the meeting at which shareholder approval was obtained pursuant to Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b). Exception 13(b) also ceases to be available if there is a material change to the terms of the scheme from those set out in the notice of meeting.

#### 6.2 Technical Information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If this Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to issue Securities under the Plan to eligible participants over a period of 3 years. The issue of any Securities to eligible participants under the Plan (up to the maximum number of Securities stated in Section 6.3 below) will be excluded from the calculation of the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Company must seek Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 10.14 in respect of any future issues of Securities under the Plan to a related party or a person whose relationship with the Company or the related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained.

If this Resolution is not passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of Securities under the Plan to eligible participants, but any issues of Securities will reduce, to that extent, the Company's capacity to issue equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12-month period following the issue of the Securities.

### Rights attaching to Convertible Securities

A **Convertible Security** represents a right to acquire one or more Plan Shares in accordance with the Plan (for example, an Option or a Performance Right).

Prior to a Convertible Security being exercised, the holder:

- (a) does not have any interest (legal, equitable or otherwise) in any Share the subject of the Convertible Security other than as expressly set out in the Plan;
- (b) is not entitled to receive notice of, vote at or attend a meeting of the shareholders of the Company;
- (c) is not entitled to receive any dividends declared by the Company; and

To exercise a security, the Participant must deliver a signed notice of exercise and, subject to a cashless exercise (see next paragraph below), pay the exercise price (if any) to or as directed by the Company, at any time following vesting of the Convertible Securities (if subject to vesting conditions) and prior to the expiry date as set out in the invitation or vesting notice.
